- **Provide market access support**, such as business advice and reports on geographical indications in Canada, to EU companies seeking to benefit from growth opportunities available under CETA

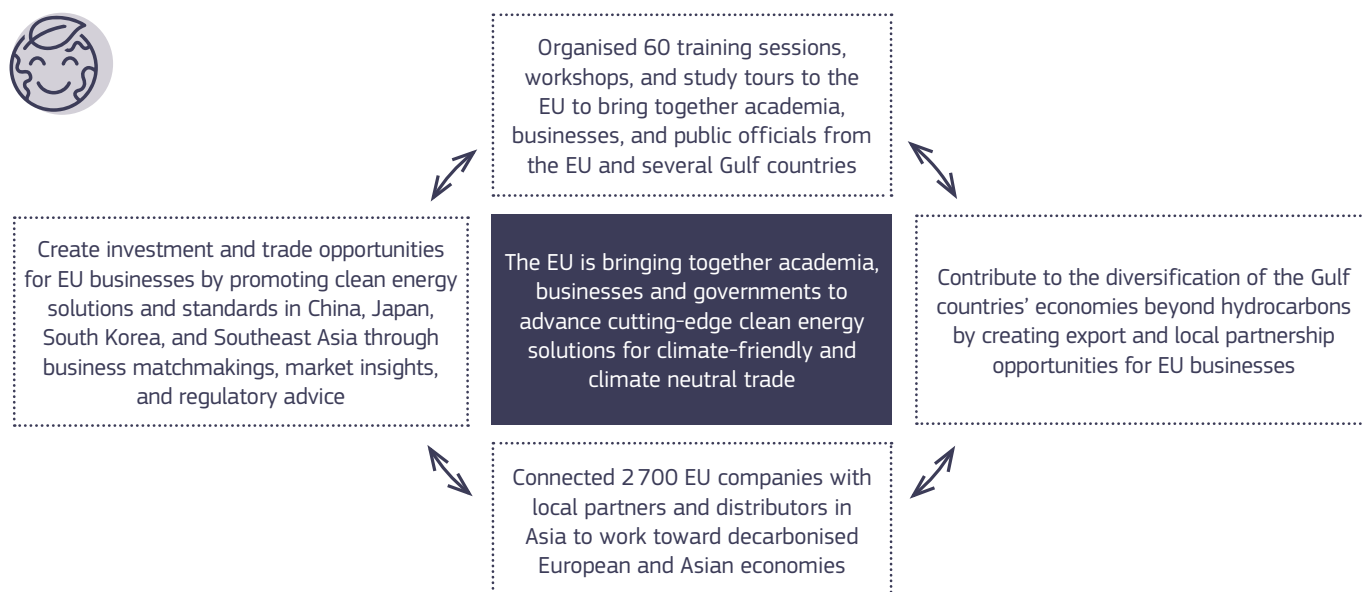
- ▶ Support the monitoring of Japan's compliance with common regulatory standards under the trade agreement, and funded a Step-by-Step User Guide for EU companies

## SETTING HIGH ENVIRONMENTAL AND SOCIAL STANDARDS ACROSS GLOBAL VALUE CHAINS



Using its trade and economic weight, the EU shapes global trade to protect workers and the environment both within and beyond the EU.

- ▶ Drive the implementation of the **UN Guiding Principles on Business and Human Rights** among Asian and Latin American governments, businesses, and investors through 'train the trainers' sessions, policy dialogue, and joint research
- ▶ Prevent social dumping through technical assistance and joint activities with the Chinese government to build inclusive, effective and sustainable **social protection systems and safe working conditions** in China and decent and inclusive work in the EU
- ▶ Set benchmarks and shape legislation on social and solidarity economy enterprises (SSEs) through peer-learning activities and partnerships between EU and their foreign counterparts
- ▶ Connect EU and **foreign civil society organisations** to ensure participatory implementation of trade agreements that protects workers and the planet
- ▶ Work with Asian and Latin American investors, businesses, and governments to realise **gender equality** as a part of inclusive and equitable global growth through booklets on Women's Economic Empowerment through Responsible Business Conduct in G7 countries
